last long beyond their time at camp.

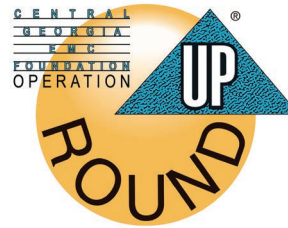

6. Visit your billing, payment, and usage histories.

8. Set up a variety of account alerts, from billing due dates to daily energy use. Choose to receive alerts by text message, email, or voice message.
9. View or report an outage and request callback notification upon restoration.

Is your heating or cooling system in need of replacement? Are you interested in energy-efficient home improvements? Central Georgia EMC (CGEMC) would like to help you stretch your energy dollar and potentially save money with our HomePlus Loan program.

CGEMC and the Georgia EMC Federal Credit Union (GEMC FCU) have partnered to offer home improvement loans for energy efficiency to CGEMC customer-owners. To qualify, you must be a customer-owner in good standing with CGEMC and meet financing standards set by GEMC FCU. With an approved loan, your monthly payment will appear on your CGEMC utility bill as a HomePlus Loan line item.

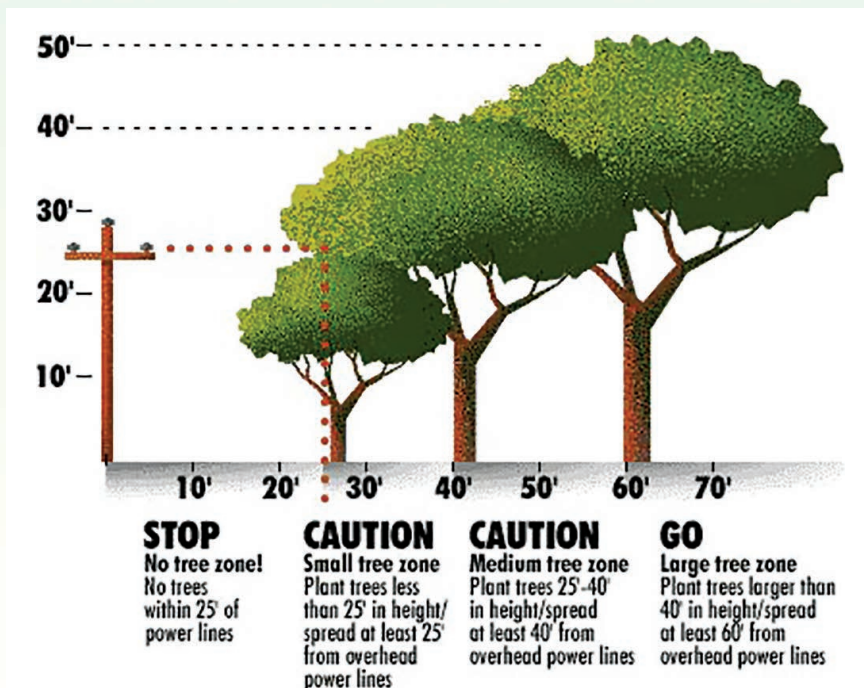
The HomePlus Loan is for the purchase and installation of the following types of equipment in existing homes:

- ENERGY STAR-rated heating and cooling systems
- ENERGY STAR-rated windows
- ENERGY STAR-rated electric and solar water heaters
- Insulation for home attics, walls, crawl spaces, and basements
- Weatherization items (weather stripping, caulking, sealing, and insulation ductwork)

Topping:

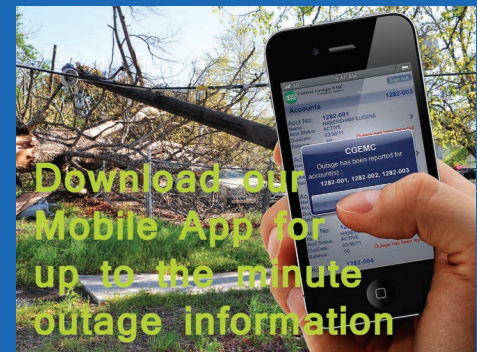
- 1/2 cup margarine, melted
