Are You Considering an Electric Vehicle? Consider Time of Use

Once a high-tech novelty, electric vehicles (EVs) are becoming increasingly popular. Improvements in EV technology, resulting in a longer driving range per charge, coupled with overall decreasing costs, are influencing consumers to go green with their transportation options. According to the U.S. Department of Energy, plug-in electric vehicles can save you money with much lower fuel costs, on average, than conventional gasoline-powered vehicles. To compare the costs of driving with electricity to cars that use regular gasoline, visit www.energy.gov/eGallon.

For those who currently drive a plug-in EV, or those thinking about making the switch, consider signing up for Central Georgia EMC's Residential Time-of-Use (TOU) rate option. This rate option gives residential customer-owners more control of costs by shifting electric usage from periods when prices are higher (on-peak) to periods when prices are lowest (off-peak). The TOU rate option offers potential savings when you charge your vehicle during off-peak hours.

Electricity used between 2 p.m. and 8 p.m., Monday through Friday, June through September (excluding the observed Independence Day and Labor Day holidays) is on-peak and subject to a higher cost per kilowatt hour (kWh). All other hours are considered off-peak and carry a lower cost per kWh.



Time-of-Use Rate

Off-Peak kWh	\$0.060
On-Peak kWh	\$0.250

The On-Peak Energy shall be all kilowatt-hours (kWh) used by the customer during the on-peak hours beginning at 2 p.m. and ending at 8 p.m., Monday through Friday, from June 1 through September 30, excluding the observed Independence Day and Labor Day holidays.

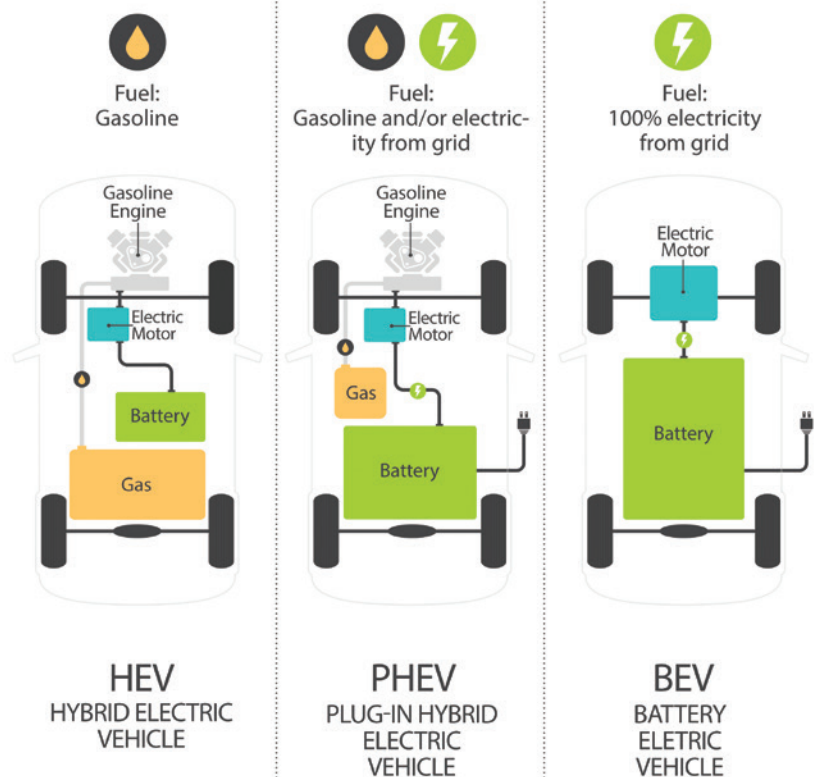

Recipe of the Month



Blue Ribbon Cheese Cake

From the kitchen of **Mildred Graham**



Ingredients:

- 10 ounces cream cheese, softened
- 2 eggs, beaten
- ¾ cup sugar
- 2 teaspoons vanilla
- 1 teaspoon lemon juice
- 1 prepared graham cracker crust

Topping:

- 1 cup sour cream
- 3 ½ tablespoons sugar
- 1 teaspoon vanilla

Directions:

Beat cream cheese and sugar until fluffy. Add eggs, vanilla, and lemon juice. Mix well. Pour into pie shell and bake at 325 degrees for 30-35 minutes. Blend topping ingredients well. Remove pie from oven and spread topping evenly. Return to oven and bake 10 minutes. Let cool before serving. Optional: add fruit of choice for topping.
