

Jalapeno Cheese Grits

- 1 1/2 cups uncooked quick grits
- 4 ounces sharp cheddar cheese
- 4 ounces grated Monterey Jack cheese with peppers
- 4 ounces grated mozzarella cheese
- 1 stick of butter
- 3 large eggs, beaten
- 1/4 cup sliced pickled jalapenos in juice (optional)

Salt and pepper to taste

Preheat oven to 350 degrees. Cook grits according to directions. Mix remaining ingredients in large mixing bowl. Add grits and stir well until blended. Bake in a buttered casserole dish for 30 minutes. Serve hot.

Local Student Could Earn a \$1,000 Scholarship

Central Georgia EMC is encouraging high school students and current college and technical school students to submit applications for the Walter Harrison Scholarship, a program sponsored by Georgia's 41 electric cooperatives.



Ten scholarships will be awarded statewide in 2016. The \$1,000 scholarship may be applied to academic expenses at any accredited two- or four-year university, college or vocational-technical institute in Georgia. Factors for consideration include gradepoint average, SAT scores, academic standing, scholastic honors, and financial need.

Scholarship applicants must be accepted or enrolled in an accredited undergraduate degree program. They must also complete an application and write an autobiographical sketch that provides a preview of their plans. Students who live in a primary residence served by CGEMC are eligible to apply. Students interested in applying for the Walter Harrison Scholarship can review the qualifications and download an application at www.cgemc.com/walter-g-harrison-scholarship/ or contact Central Georgia EMC's Member Services Department at 770-504-7831.

The scholarship, created in 1985 by the board of directors of Georgia EMC, pays tribute to the late Walter Harrison, a pioneer in the rural electric movement and a leader at local, state, and national levels in the electric cooperative program.
