It is with heavy hearts that we announce the passing of Central Georgia EMC (CGEMC) Chief Operating Officer John E. Fish on October 11, 2017. John began his electric cooperative career at Cobb EMC in April 1986 and served the CGEMC membership since February 1990.

Under John's leadership, CGEMC experienced unprecedented growth of more than 150 percent. John was instrumental in the implementation of technologies leading to more reliable, affordable energy for all of our customer-owners as well as advocating for electric cooperatives on the state and national levels.

Central Georgia EMC and all of its business partners extend our deepest sympathies to the Fish family.

Tropical Storm Irma Knocks Out Power to CGEMC System



High winds and heavy rain caused by Tropical Storm Irma beginning on Monday, September 11, 2017, had a devastating effect on Central Georgia Electric Membership Corporation's electrical system. Overall, 33,889 of the cooperative's 55,133-metered customer-owners were left without power.

Irma's path of destruction included miles of tangled power lines buried under fallen trees, and 115 broken poles throughout our 14-county service territory. Crews worked throughout the day and night from the beginning of the storm. Power was restored to all CGEMC customer-owners by 9 p.m. Friday, September 15, 2017.


Central Georgia EMC would like to thank all customer-owners who were affected by the outages caused by this storm for their patience and cooperation during outage restoration.

Residential Service Rate Adjustment Effective January 1, 2018

Effective with billings that begin January 1, 2018, Central Georgia EMC's residential service charge will adjust to \$25 per month from the current \$22.

The service charge is a fixed amount each billing period. It covers member accounting, power distribution (construction, maintenance, metering, and outage restoration), and availability of energy from a generating source.

Even with this adjustment to the service charge, Central Georgia EMC remains one of the lowest-cost electric utilities in the state. 

Load Management Savings

Central Georgia EMC would like to thank all customer-owners who participated in the 2017 Load Management Switch Program. We enacted load management 11 times from June 1 to August 31, 2017. Eleven megawatts of peak system load was shed, with 605,000 kilowatt-hours saved during peak energy usage times. Participating customers can look for an annual bill credit on their November statement (\$20 for an air-conditioning switch and \$10 for a water heater switch, with a \$30 maximum credit).

Chicken and Dumpling Casserole

Ingredients:

- 2 chicken breasts, cooked and shredded
- 2 cups chicken broth
- 1/4 cup butter
- 2 cups all-purpose baking mix
- 2 cups milk
- 1 can cream of chicken soup
- 3 teaspoons chicken bouillon
- 1/2 teaspoon sage
- 1 teaspoon pepper

Directions:

Preheat oven to 350 degrees.

- Layer 1: In a 9-by-13-inch pan, melt 1/2 stick butter. Spread chicken over butter. Sprinkle sage and pepper over chicken. Do not stir.
- Layer 2: Mix milk and all-purpose baking mix. Slowly pour over chicken. Do not stir.
- Layer 3: Whisk together 2 cups chicken broth, bouillon, and soup. Slowly pour over second layer. Do not stir.

Bake 30 to 40 minutes, or until top is golden brown.
